On September 29, 2016, the Chicago Cancer Health Equity Collaborative (ChicagoCHEC) held our first annual symposium at Malcolm X College, “Keeping Cancer in CHEC: Bridging Communities through Education, Health Care, and Research”. 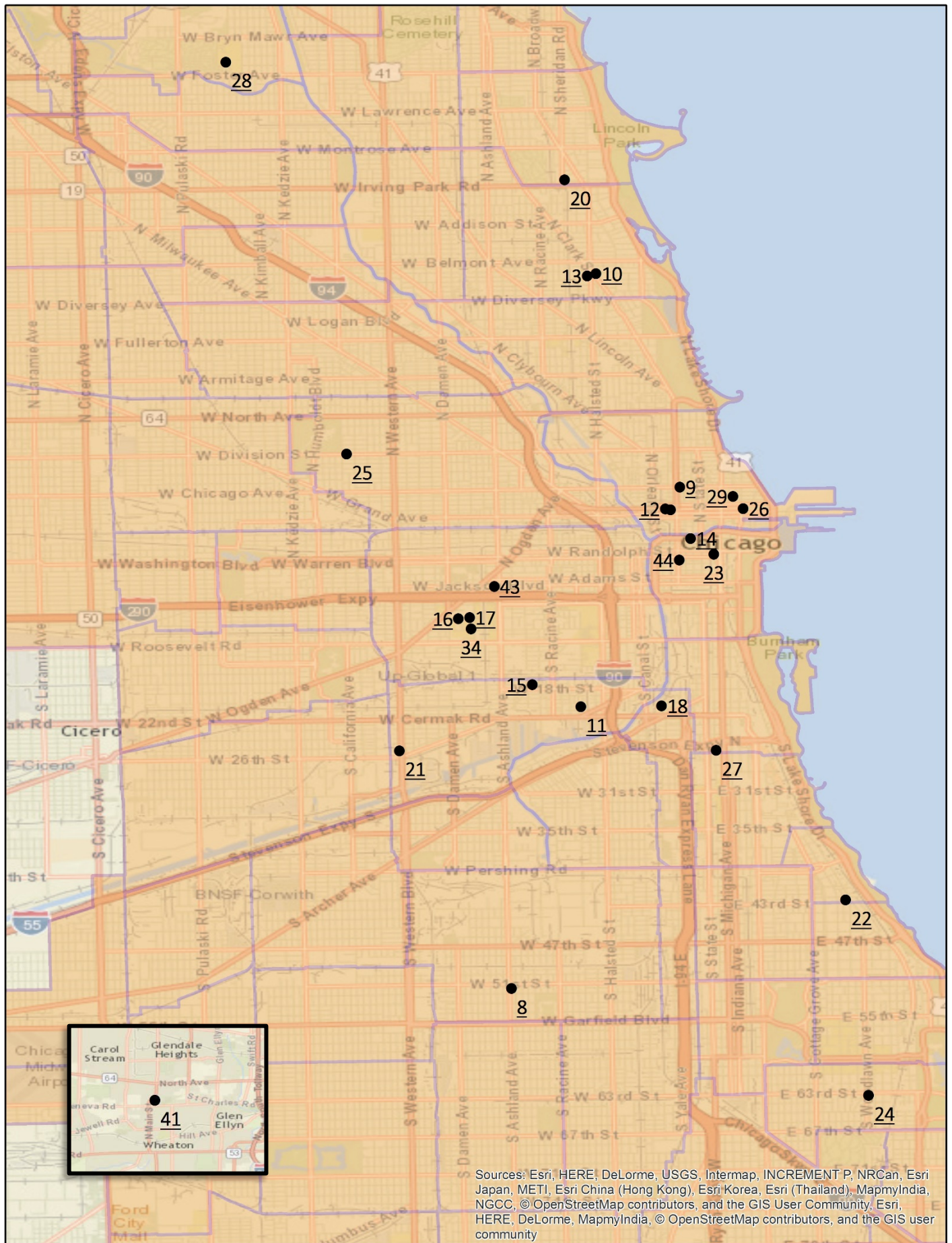
